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Allen Testing And Cognitive Levels

The Allen Cognitive Level Screen (ACLS) is a test that evaluates the ability of someone to make decisions, function independently, safely perform basic skills, and learn new abilities. This assessment was developed by Claudia K. Allen, along with her colleagues.

What Is the Allen Cognitive Level Scale and Screen?

The Allen Cognitive Levels scale or ACL Scale (Allen & Blue, 1998) was developed in the late 1960's by Allen and colleagues through systematic observation and documentation of predictable patterns of performance of adults in inpatient mental health settings as they engaged in activities of daily living (ADLs), instrumental activities of daily living (IADLs) and leisure activities.
