When growing alfalfa, choose an area with plenty of full sun. Also look for a well-draining area with a soil pH level between 6.8 and 7.5. Prior to planting, you should clean the area, work the soil, and remove any debris. Pure alfalfa seed can be purchased from most feed supply stores. How to Plant Alfalfa. Those living in cooler climates can plant alfalfa in spring while milder regions should opt for fall planting.

Planting Alfalfa: How To Grow Alfalfa

To grow alfalfa sprouts, rinse 1 tablespoon of alfalfa seeds and put them in a glass jar. Next, cover the seeds with 2 inches of cold water, cover the mouth of the jar with cheesecloth, and soak the seeds for 12 hours in a dry, warm place.

Planting Alfalfa: For those living in cooler climates, plant in early spring. Mild to warm climates, plant in the fall. Plant each seed about half an inch deep and cover lightly with soil. Use 1/4 pound of seeds per every 25 square feet and space rows 18-24 inches apart. Alfalfa sprouts should emerge within 7 to 10 days.

How to Grow Alfalfa - Plant Instructions

Sunlight: partial sun/shade – around 3-4 hours of morning/evening sunlight with some afternoon shade. Alfalfa sprouts can be grown quickly in just 3 to 5 days indoors. It can be grown in a glass jar or a small tray. After the sprouts have grown from 3 to 5 inches, they are transplanted to the garden beds.

Alfalfa Planting Depth Optimal seeding depth for legumes and grasses is less than one inch. In fine-textured and moist soils, seeds should be planted closer to the surface, from 1/2 to 1/4 inch. In summer or drier periods or in sandy soils, deeper planting (3/4 to 1 inch) is recommended.

A good alfalfa seedbed is one that makes you want to bring friends to the field and say, "I did that." If your seedbed is not that good, don't plant alfalfa. Use a drill to plant. Do not broadcast seed and till it in. If you can't use a drill, don't plant alfalfa. Common Mistake Number 4: Plant it and forget it. Cattle love alfalfa.

Common Mistakes in Growing Alfalfa

How to growing alfalfa sprouts. The easiest way to grow your own is buy placing two tbsp of seeds into the jar. Next, cover them with a few inches of cool water. Then, take a cheesecloth. Cover the top of the jar with it, securing it with a rubber band. Finally, soak the seeds overnight, making sure to drain off the water.

How to grow Alfalfa in a pot For use in salads as sprouts Choose a well lit spot indoors that is away from direct heat or sunlight. Using a large, wide mouthed glass jar, place the seeds into the jar and soak in lukewarm water for approximately 3 hours.

Place the alfalfa sprouting seeds in a large mason jar, a pinch of sea salt and cover with 250ml of water. Cover the glass jar with a piece of cheesecloth and secure it with an elastic band or use a wide mouth mason jar sprouting lid. Let soak overnight on the countertop. Every morning and night for about 4 to 5 days

Cut the grass or alfalfa using a scythe or shears. Depending on the size of your harvest, chop the grass or alfalfa about 1-2 inches (2.5-5.1 cm) from the roots. After cutting the hay, gather it in a container for curing later on. For larger crops, you can use a rotary disk or sickle mower instead.
